

Located in western Kentucky, Murray State University is a nationally-recognized public regional comprehensive university. Murray State University offers in-person academic programs and 100 percent online programs at its Murray campus, as well as regional campuses in Fort Campbell, Henderson, Hopkinsville, Madisonville and Paducah. A total of 52 countries, 49 states and 115 counties in Kentucky comprise Murray State's student body.

Based on a 2017 comprehensive study led by Professor Emeritus Dr. Gil Mathis, updated for inflation, Murray State University generates more than \$633 million in economic output activity through the Commonwealth.

EMPLOYMENT IMPACT

Murray State University confers thousands of degrees each year, but the University's impact on the Commonwealth of Kentucky extends far beyond our graduates.

According to the previous study, for each individual directly employed by Murray State, another 3.35 jobs are created indirectly based on the University's business operations. Murray State's number of employees is currently 1,385 individuals, so an estimated number of 4,640 indirect jobs are being created.

CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS: 2024-2030

The 2024 state biennium budget includes funding and support for Murray State University, including a record amount of capital projects funding. Based on a 2024 Economic Impact Report led by Murray State Professor of Economics Dr. Simone Silva, the construction projects will generate more than \$348 million in economic output activity from 2024-2030.
