

2024-2030 construction projects


- New School of Nursing and Health Professions \$45.5 Million (2022 Budget)
- New Veterinary Sciences Building \$60 Million
- New Learning Commons/Residential Hall \$38 Million
- Asset Preservation/Deferred Maintenance/Campus Improvements \$46.6 Million
- Cyber Center/Cybersecurity Programs \$10 Million







- 1,385 Employees
 - PLUS 1,428 students working on campus
- 6,025 Kentucky Jobs
 - Total direct and indirect jobs created
