FOOTNOTES

- 1. Six successful semesters of MUS 101 Recital Assembly are required.
- 2. Music/Music Business majors take applied lessons for four semesters, passing the sophomore barrier as their performance requirement.
- 3. Non-keyboard majors must take the appropriate functional keyboard class for two semesters. All keyboard majors must pass the Functional Keyboard Level IV competency exam. Keyboard majors who have fulfilled the functional keyboard requirement may elect to study another instrument with the approval of the academic advisor.
- 4. Concurrent with each semester of applied study, students are required to enroll in a major performing ensemble involving a student's applied major or secondary area with the approval of the ensemble director. Additional semesters of study require participation in a major ensemble concurrent with each semester of study. Keyboard majors may be allowed to take accompanying classes (MUS 136 and MUS 336) in place of a major ensemble for two semesters.
- 5. Music electives must include at least 6 hours of upper level courses (300-level or above) for graduation.
- **6**. Required University Studies Course: ECO 231: Microeconomics.
- **7.** Required University Studies Course: ECO 230: Macroeconomics.
- **8.** Recommended elective.

COURSE SEQUENCES AND GRADE REQUIREMENTS

All applied lessons require a "C" or better to continue in the sequence.

MUS 170, MUS 173, MUS 270, MUS 273 must be taken in sequence, with a "C" or better to continue in the sequence.

MUS 171, MUS 174, MUS 271, MUS 274 must be taken in sequence, with a "C" or better to continue in the sequence.

MUS 172 and MUS 175 must be taken in sequence, with a "C" or better to continue in the sequence.

MUS 381 must be taken first in the Music History Sequence, and the grade of "C" or better is required to continue in the sequence. MUS 382 & MUS 383 may be taken in any order.
