

23.3% of respondents who provided demographic information identified as Murray State alumni.


Student Responses (N = 288)







Faculty: University Studies Teaching Load




80.6% of faculty respondents reported having undergraduate advising responsibilities.


Staff: Length of Employment



32.6% of staff respondents reported having undergraduate advising responsibilities.



Year in School






Primary College (82% of Majors Represented)



Characteristics of the Murray State University Graduate



- Apply sound standards of information gathering, analysis, and evaluation to reach logical decisions;
- Understand the roles and applications of science and technology in the solution of the problems of a changing world;
- Demonstrate a critical understanding of the world's historical, literary, philosophical, and artistic traditions;
- Understand the dynamics of cultural diversity, of competing economic and political systems, and of complex moral and ethical issues;
- Understand the importance of and engage in ethical behavior and responsible citizenship;
- Understand the importance of the behaviors necessary to maintain a healthy lifestyle;
- Demonstrate mastery of a chosen field of study, and
- Value intellectual pursuit and continuous learning in a changing world.








What is the optimum credit hour requirement for the University Studies program at Murray State?



Students: To what extent should the existing University Studies program be modified?












Faculty/Staff and Student Importance Comparison




Faculty/Staff and Student Differences: Importance




Faculty and Staff Differences: Importance





Summary

Characteristics of the Murray State University Graduate

There was broad agreement that these characteristics represent what Murray State students currently need to successfully contribute to our world.

There was moderate agreement that the current University Studies program helps students achieve these characteristics.

Credit Hours

Most faculty and staff indicated that the current University Studies programs consists of too many credit hours.

Modifications

About half of faculty, staff, and students reported that minor modifications should be made to the University Studies program.

In general, students reported that less extensive modifications should be made than faculty/staff.

Competencies: Importance

Faculty and staff identified critical thinking, written and oral communication, and ethical issues and decisions as the most important competencies.

Students identified professionalism, real world experiences and problems, critical thinking, and interpersonal skills as the most important competencies.

There was general agreement that the competencies included in the survey are important targets for the University Studies program.

Competencies: Importance (Continued)

Students and faculty/staff ratings were generally in agreement, although faculty and staff tended to rate most competencies as more important than students.

Students perceived professionalism to be more important relative to faculty and staff ratings.

Competencies: Effectiveness

Overall, faculty, staff and students reported that the current University Studies program is moderately effective at achieving core competencies.

Students and faculty/staff ratings were generally in agreement, although students tended to give higher effectiveness ratings than faculty.

Qualitative Responses

Over 500 comments were submitted as part of the stakeholder surveys.

• Comments include suggestions for additional competencies and new courses, identification of strengthens and weakness of the existing program, and general feedback and recommendations.

The review and renewal workgroup has reviewed these comments and used them to inform the renewal process.
