20 21 **CONSTITUTION OF THE** 22 STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION 23 OF MURRAY STATE UNIVERSITY 24 25 PURPOSE: The purposes of the Student Government Association are to promote the welfare, 26 growth, and development of student life in an environment of academic excellence, 27 to represent the students in all phases of administrative effort, and to provide a 28 means of promoting cooperative efforts for the general welfare of the University 29 community. 30 31 ARTICLE I. **COMPOSITION & ELIGIBILITY** 32 33 Section I. The officially organized body governing all students and student 34 organizations at Murray State University shall be the Student Government 35 Association. The Student Government Association (hereinafter S.G.A.) shall 36 be composed of the Student Senate, the Judicial Board, the Campus Activities 37 Board, the Residential College Association, and any other boards as agencies 38 created in accordance with the By-Laws. 39 40 Section 2. Any full-time student and any part-time student (a part time student, for the 41 purposes of this constitution, shall be defined as any student enrolled in 7 to 42 11 hours for undergraduates or in 5 to 8 hours for graduate students) shall 43 have the privilege of seeking office in any branch of the S.G.A. as prescribed 44 in the By-Laws. Part-time students are not eligible to run for or hold 45 **Executive Council positions.** 46 47 ARTICLE II. **OFFICERS** 48 49 Section 1. The officers of S.G.A. shall be President, Executive Vice-President, Vice-50 President of Administration and Vice-President of Finance of the Student 51 Senate. 52 53 Section 2. The President shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the S.G.A. and serve as 54 the Student Regent on the university Board of Regents. The qualifications for 55 the office require one to be a full time student at the time of election and 56 thereafter. In addition, the President shall have attained at least Junior Class 57 standing the fall semester following the election. The President's duties and 58 powers shall be to serve as President of the Student Senate and to serve as 59 an ex-officio member of all S.G.A. committees, councils, and boards. The

60 office holder shall maintain these standards, as well as others prescribed in 61 the by-laws, at the time of election and during the term of office. 62 63 Section 3. The Executive Vice President, whose qualifications shall be the same as those 64 for President, shall serve as Vice President of the Senate and as Chairman of 65 the Campus Activities Board. 66 67 Section 4. The Vice President of Administration shall serve as the Secretary of the 68 Student Senate and Campus Activities Board. The Vice President of 69 Administration must be a full-time student. The office holder shall maintain 70 these standards, as well as others prescribed in the by-laws, at the time of 71 election and during the term of office. 72 73 Section 5. The Vice President of Finance shall serve as the Treasurer of the S.G.A. and 74 monitor all funds received from the University. The Vice President of Finance 75 shall be a full-time student. The office holder shall maintain these standards, 76 as well as others prescribed in the by-laws, at the time of election and during 77 the term of office. 78 79 Section 6. The President of RCA and the Chief Justice shall be considered as "ex-officio" 80 members of Executive Council, they shall work as liaisons for their respective 81 branches, but will not have voting privileges in the Executive Council or 82 Senate. 83 84 ARTICLE III. THE STUDENT SENATE 85 86 Section I. The Student Senate shall be the governing body of S.G.A. and shall have the 87 power to pass resolutions, bills, rules, and regulations necessary for the 88 general welfare of the University and to implement and maintain any 89 programs consistent with S.G.A. purposes. 90 91 Section 2. The Senate shall be composed of the Executive Council of the S.G.A., three (3) 92 elected senators from each Academic College or School of the University, 93 two (2) freshman senators, eight (8) senators elected at-large, and two (2) 94 senators from each Residential College who, along with the members of the 95 Executive Council shall have the right to vote. The President of the S.G.A. 96 shall only vote in case of a tie. 97 98 Section 3. There shall be six (6) Director positions, which shall serve as standing 99 committee senate chairs. These positions shall consist of: Election Ways and

100		Means, University Affairs, Public Relations, Government Relations,
101		Multimedia, and Diversity and Inclusion. These positions will not have voting
102		privileges in the Student Senate. The specific duties of these offices are
103		described in the By-laws (Article IV. Section C and Article V and Article VI).
104		
105	Section 4.	In order to be a member of the Senate one shall be a full-time student or a
106		part-time student of the University and shall maintain all qualifications as
107		established in the by-laws at the time of elections and during the term of
108		office.
109		
110	Section 5.	The officeholders for "freshman senator" must have completed no more
111		than 30 credit hours, at the time of election.
112		
113	Section 6.	The Senate shall be advised by the Student Activities Advisor/ Administrative
114		Assistant to the S.G.A.
115		
116	ARTICLE IV. TH	E JUDICIAL BOARD
117		
118	Section I.	The Judicial Board shall have the power to hold hearings and to render
119		decisions and interpretations in cases brought to it by students, faculty, staff,
120		or administrators involving the University Code of Conduct or the
121		Constitution of the S.G.A. It shall have the authority to hear parking/traffic
122		violation appeals.
123		
124	Section 2.	The Judicial Board shall comply with the Kentucky Open Meetings Laws, KRS
125		61.800 et.seq. and shall notify interested parties of their meetings at least
126		one (1) week in advance.
127		
128	Section 3.	The Judicial Board shall be the judicial branch of the S.G.A. and shall be
129		composed of seven (7) Justices and (3) Alternative Associate Justices.
130		
131	Section 4.	The Judicial Board Chief Justice shall serve as Chairperson of the Murray
132		State University Student Judicial Board. The Chief Justice will preside over the
133		Murray State University Student Judicial Board and be responsible for
134		communicating concerns and issues to the S.G.A. Executive Council. The
135		Chief Justice shall serve as a liaison between the S.G.A., Public Safety, and
136		various judicial offices of the university. This position will be selected by the
137		S.G.A. President, then confirmed by the Student Senate; from the members
138		selected to serve on the Murray State University Student Judicial Board. The
139		Student Senate must confirm this position annually. The Chief Justice of the

140 141		Judicial Board will be responsible for a report to the Student Senate each week or following each specially called Judicial Board hearing.
142		
143	Section 5.	The S.G.A. shall solicit applications for the Judicial Board. The Executive
144		Council shall interview the applicants and the S.G.A. President shall select ten
145		(10) nominees for the seven (7) Associate Justices, (3) Alternate Associate
146		Justices, and from the list of nominations recommending a Chief Justice and
147		an Associate Chief Justice. Upon the nomination from the S.G.A. President,
148		the Senate must confirm the nominees.
149		
150	Section 6.	No member of the Judicial Board shall vote on any question in which he/she
151		has an interest.
152		
153	Section 7.	Structure of the Judicial Board, qualifications of membership, duration of
154		term, specific duties and responsibilities, absences and vacancies, etc. shall
155		be detailed by the By-Laws, otherwise known as the Judicial Board Operating
156		Principles.
157		
158	ARTICLE V. TH	E CAMPUS ACTIVITIES BOARD
159		
160	Section 1.	The purpose of the Campus Activities Board shall be to serve and unify the
161		interests of the students, faculty and staff of M.S.U. and the university
162		service region through co-curricular programming and policy
163		recommendations for the operation of the University Center.
164		
165	Section 2.	Funding for the Campus Activities Board shall be through the accounts of the
166		S.G.A.
167		
168	Section 3.	Structure of the Campus Activities Board, qualifications of membership,
169		duration of term, specific duties and responsibilities, absences and vacancies,
170		etc. shall be detailed by the By-Laws in accordance with the Campus
171		Activities Board Operating Principles.
172		
173	ARTICLE VI. RESI	IDENTIAL COLLEGE ASSOCIATION
174		
175	Section 1.	The Residential College Association shall serve as the voice of the students of
176		the Residential Colleges. The organization will maintain its own By-laws and
177		function to increase communication between residential students and S.G.A.
178		
179	Section 2.	The membership of the Residential College Association shall consist of the

181		College, at least one representative chosen by election from each college and
182		President of NRHH. Each college shall have one vote.
183		
184	Section 3.	The officers of the Residential College Association shall be the President,
185		Vice-President of Programming, Vice-President of Finance and Records, Vice-
186		President of Recognition, Vice-President of Leadership and Development.
187		
188	Section 4.	The Residential College Association President shall preside over the
189		Residential College Association and shall be responsible for communicating
190		R.C.A. concerns to the S.G.A. Executive Council. The R.C.A. President shall be
191		a full-time student. The R.C.A. President shall be elected during the S.G.A.
192		elections each spring by a student body vote. The office holder shall
193		maintain these standards, as well as others prescribed in the by-laws, at the
194		time of election and during the term of office.
195		
196	Section 5.	The budget for the Residential College Association shall remain based upon a
197		fee levied on students who live within the Residential Colleges.
198		
199	Section 6.	The individual Residential College Councils shall maintain their autonomy in
200		constitution and in their rights to create policy specific to their Residential
201		Colleges.
202		
203	ARTICLE VII. VO	TING AND CONSTITUENCIES
204		
205	Section I.	Any student enrolled in a college shall have the privilege of voting for Senate
206		positions representing that college, all S.G.A. officer positions, at-large
207		Senate positions. Any student with 30 credit hours or less may have the
208		privilege of voting for the "freshman senators."
209		
210	Section 2.	The primary constituency of S.G.A. officers, at-large Senators and students on
211		the Campus Activities Board shall be all students in the university. The
212		primary constituency of a Senator representing a university or residential
213		college or school shall be students in that college. The primary constituency
214		of the "freshman senators" shall be the freshman class.
215		
216	ARTICLE VIII. RE	MOVAL FROM OFFICE
217		
218	Section 1.	The Student Senate or the Judicial Board shall have the power to remove
219		from office any member of its respective body for cause by a two-thirds (2/3)

222	Section 2.	Senators or Executive Officers of the S.G.A. can be recalled on the petition of				
223		twenty-five percent (25%) of their respective constituencies, subject to a				
224		majority vote of such constituency

226	ARTICLE IX. AN	MENDMENTS AND BYLAWS				
227						
228	Section I.	The Student Senate shall have the power to enact by-laws to implement the				
229		provisions of this Constitution.				
230						
231	Section 2.	Any proposed changes in the By-laws shall be endorsed by one-fifth (I/5) of				
232		the Senators, and shall require approval by two-thirds (2/3) of the				
233		membership of the Senate.				
234						
235	Section 3.	Amendments to this constitution can be proposed by a three-fourths (3/4				
236		majority vote of the Student Senate or by a petition signed by 25% of the				
237		total Student Body. Such amendments shall be ratified by a plurality vote of				
238		the student electorate subject to approval of the M.S.U. Board of Regents.

240	ARTICLE X. RA	<u>TIFICATION</u>				
241						
242	Section I.	This Constitution shall be ratified by a majority of those voting, subject to				
243		final approval of the Murray State University Board of Regents.
